Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father, Lord God, Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world: have mercy on us; you are seated at the right hand of the Father: receive our prayer.

For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the Glory of God the Father. Amen.

The celebrant prays the Collect of the Day

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

THE FIRST READING Jeremiah 20:7-9

You have seduced me, Lord, and I have let myself be seduced; you have overpowered me: you were the stronger. I am a daily laughing-stock, everybody's butt. Each time I speak the word, I have to howl and proclaim: 'Violence and ruin!' The word of the Lord has meant for me insult, derision, all day long. I used to say, 'I will not think about him, I will not speak in his name any more.' Then there seemed to be a fire burning in my heart, imprisoned in my bones. The effort to restrain it wearied me, I could not bear it

This is the word of the Lord

All: Thanks be to God.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM:

Psalm 63:2-6,8-9

R. For you my soul is thirsting, O Lord my God.

O God, you are my God, for you I long; for you my soul is thirsting.

My body pines for you like a dry, weary land without water. R.

So I gaze on you in the sanctuary to see your strength and your glory. For your love is better than life, my lips will speak your praise. **R.**

So I will bless you all my life, in your name I will lift up my hands. My soul shall be filled as with a banquet, my mouth shall praise you with joy. **R.**

For you have been my help; in the shadow of your wings I rejoice. My soul clings to you; your right hand holds me fast. **R.**

THE SECOND READING Romans 12:1-2

Think of God's mercy, my brothers, and worship him, I beg you, in a way that is worthy of thinking beings, by offering your living bodies as a holy sacrifice, truly pleasing to God. Do not model yourselves on the behaviour of the world around you, but let your behaviour change, modelled by your new mind. This is the only way to discover the will of God and know what is good, what it is that God wants, what is the perfect thing to do.

THE GOSPEL

Deacon: Alleluia, alleluia!

May the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ

enlighten the eyes of our mind,

so that we can see what hope his call holds for us.

All: Alleluia!

Deacon: The Lord be with you.

All: And also with you.

Deacon: A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew.

All: Glory to you, O Lord.

Jesus began to make it clear to his disciples that he was destined to go to Jerusalem and suffer grievously at the hands of the elders and chief priests and scribes, to be put to death and to be raised up on the third day. Then, taking him aside, Peter started to remonstrate with him. 'Heaven preserve you, Lord;' he said 'this must not happen to you.' But he turned and said to Peter, 'Get behind me, Satan! You are an obstacle in my path, because the way you think is not God's way but man's.'

Then Jesus said to his disciples, 'If anyone wants to be a follower of mine, let him renounce himself and take up his cross and follow me. For anyone who wants to save his life will lose it; but anyone who loses his life for my sake will find it. What, then, will a man gain if he wins the whole world and ruins his life? Or what has a man to offer in exchange for his life?

'For the Son of Man is going to come in the glory of his Father with his angels, and, when he does, he will reward each one according to his behaviour.'

THE CREED

The celebrant introduces the prayers

After each petition the deacon or priest says:

At the end of the Prayers of Intercession, the congregation will be invited to say:

All: Hail Mary, full of grace. the Lord is with thee.

Blessed art thou among women,

and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus.

Holy Mary, Mother of God,

pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death.

The celebrant concludes the prayers

THE LITURGY OF THE EUCHARIST

Priest: Pray, my brother and sisters in Christ,

that my sacrifice and yours

may be acceptable to God the Almighty Father.

All: May the Lord accept this sacrifice at your hands,

for the praise and glory of his name,

for our good, and for the good of all his Church.

Priest: May this sacred offering, O Lord,

confer on us always the blessing of salvation,

that what it celebrates in mystery

it may accomplish in power. Through Christ our Lord.

All: Amen.

The celebrant begins the Eucharistic Prayer

Priest: The Lord be with you All: and also with you.

Priest: Lift up your hearts.

All: We lift them to the Lord.

Priest: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

All: It is right to give thanks and praise.

The celebrant says the PREFACE. The SANCTUS and BENEDICTUS are then said:

All: Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might:

Heaven and earth are full of your glory, Hosanna, hosanna in the highest.

Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.

Hosanna, hosanna in the highest

The celebrant continues.

After the words of consecration, the deacon says:

Deacon: The mystery of faith:

All: Christ has died! Christ is risen! Christ will come again!

The Eucharistic Prayer continues until:

Priest: ... all honour and glory be yours,

almighty Father, for ever and ever. Amen.

The celebrant introduces the LORD'S PRAYER

All: Our Father,

who art in heaven,

hallowed be thy name;

thy kingdom come; thy will be done;

on earth as it is in heaven.

Give us this day our daily bread.

And forgive us our trespasses,

as we forgive those who trespass against us.

And lead us not into temptation;

but deliver us from evil.

For thine is the kingdom,

the power and the glory,

for ever and ever.

Amen.

THE PEACE

Priest: Lord Jesus Christ, who said to your Apostles:

Peace I leave you, my peace I give you, look not on our sins,

but on the faith of your Church, and graciously grant her peace and unity

in accordance with your will.

Who live and reign for ever and ever. Amen.

Priest: The peace of the Lord be always with you

All: and also with you.

The AGNUS DEI is said:

All: Lamb of God you take away the sins of the world.
