The Homily - Fr Russell

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried.

On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is worshipped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets.

All: accept these prayers for the sake of your Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ. Amen.

all glory and honour are yours, for ever and ever.

All: Amen.

We stand to say together the LORD'S PRAYER

- Priest: At the Saviour's command and formed by divine teaching, we dare to say:
- All: Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come; thy will be done; on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, the power and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen

The **AGNUS DEI** is sung:

All: Jesus, Lamb of God, Bread of life for us; Jesus, Lamb of God, Wine of Joy for us: Jesus, Lamb of God, bearing all our sins: have mercy on us give us your peace.
